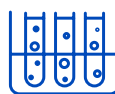

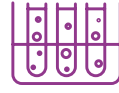


Vall d'Hebron Institute of Research

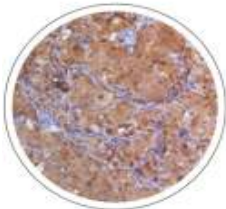

Distribution in Research Areas



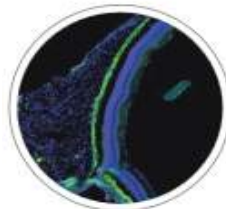

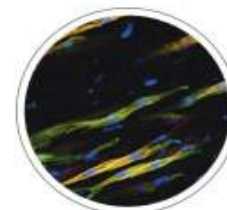

Our business development strategy is to work closely with the industry, focusing on developing collaborations through:

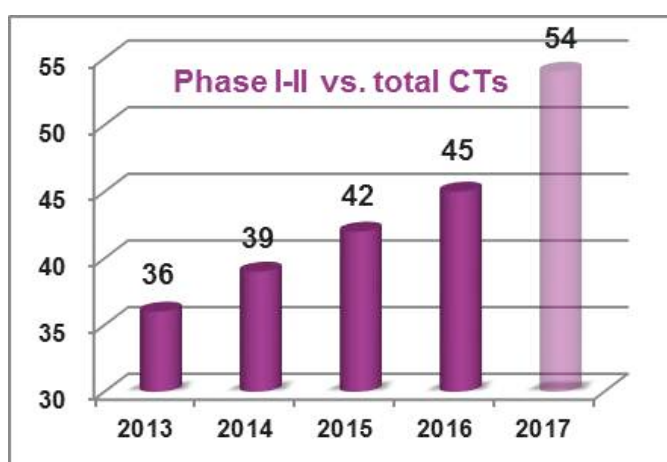
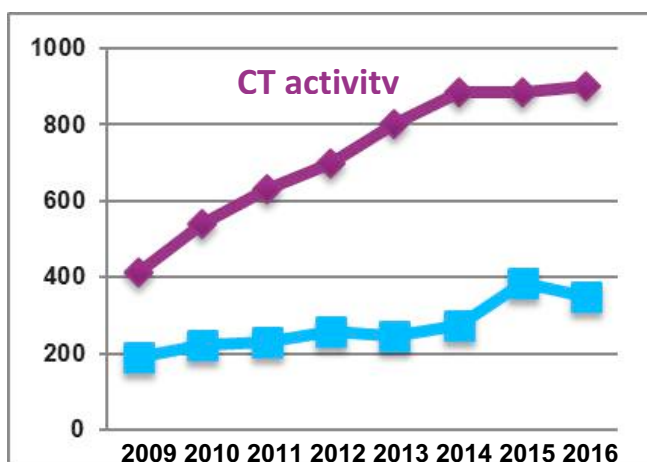

Clinical Research

Vall d'Hebron Barcelona Hospital Campus leads clinical research in Spain and Europe, both in number of clinical trials (900 active CTs and 350 new on 2016) as in complexity (54% in Phase I-II). Among others, the main fields of expertise are Oncology, Neurosciences, Infectious diseases, Cardiology, Pneumology, Immunology, Nanomedicine, Vascular Biology and Metabolism, and Liver & Digestive diseases.
